School Communication

Curriculum Information

At Muna British Academy we offer The English National Curriculum which is among the most in-demand study options in the world, respected for its high academic standards and focus on developing confidence and individual thinking.

The learning pathway is delivered through enquiry or 'project-based learning', a method of teaching which inspires a love of learning and deepens a student's knowledge by challenging them to complete real-world tasks. In this way, the English National Curriculum is considered to be one of the most engaging of all.

The teaching of Arabic subjects is based on the guidance and materials prescribed by the Ministry of Education. It keeps local and other native Arabic speaking and Muslim children familiar with their national identity and religion.

In addition, our international students gain an understanding of the UAE's heritage which helps enhance mutual understanding, peaceful co-existence and cross-cultural harmony and tolerance.

Bus Information

Emirates Transport

Bring Your Own Device

As part of our ongoing commitment to provide innovation, Muna British Academy has implemented a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) initiative for students in Years 4-6. This is a wonderful opportunity for students to use their own technology to personalise and further their learning. The students have access to a Microsoft Teams via their Office 365 account, which allow students to access their work from any location. They also have access to the One Login where they can access a wide range of educational programmes to support their learning.

We still, of course, use books to write in but using their own device can support the learning that is happening within the classroom. BYOD also gives parents an opportunity to see what their child has been learning about in school and the software mentioned above are excellent platforms to share homework and the support and resources to go with it.

If you plan to buy a personal device for your child to use in school, you must purchase an iPad (9th generation or higher).

Device Eligibility:

Year 4 - Year 7: Students are encouraged to bring their own iPad (9th generation or higher).

Year 3: Students may bring their own iPad (9th generation or higher), but it is not mandatory.

Year 1 and Year 2: Personal devices are not permitted. The school provides adequate devices for learning activities.

Nursery and FS2: Personal devices are not permitted.



Online Education Platforms

All Children have access to a Microsoft 365 account. On here, they have the use of all Microsoft programmes. One login is used for all educational apps including Centurey and Accelerated Reader.

Please note that we do not accept any cash payments.

We would like to request you to use the following payment options available for you to make school fee payments:

- **Online Credit Card Payment Option** - Aldar Education accepts credit card payments through a secure payment link embedded on invoices and emails.
- **Bank Transfer Payment Option** - Please refer to the bank details provided on the invoice for bank transfer payment. Kindly include the Student Codes and Invoice References in the payment description fields and send an email confirmation of the payment to the school's finance email address.
- **Cheques payment** - Please put these in a sealed envelope with the Student Codes and Invoice References on the reverse of the cheque and submit to Finance Department. Upon clearance of the cheque, an official receipt will be issued to the registered email address within 3 working days.

We believe this change will benefit how our schools operate more efficiently to serve you and help reduce the need for handling or transporting cash.

For ease, invoices will be shared to your registered email address and will be available on the parent portal. We would kindly ask that fees are paid by the due date mentioned on the invoice. 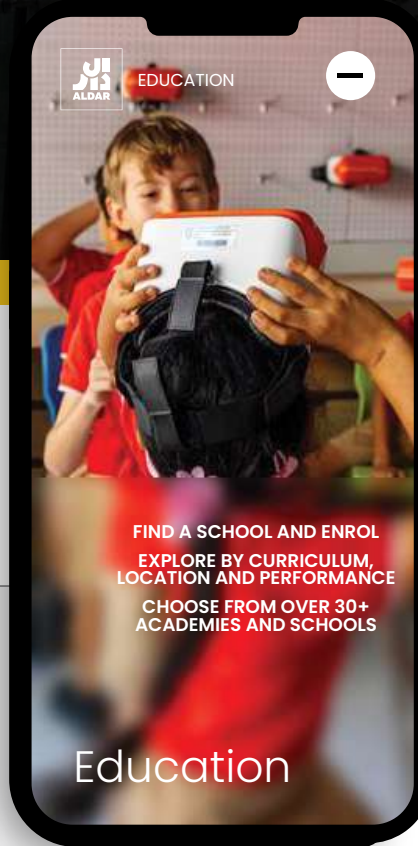
